

HIGHWAY BOARD.-A meeting of the Highway Board was held on Monday afternoon, the waywardens present being Messrs. C. Dowden (who was voted to the chair), C. Frampton, C. Hunt, W. Ellison, H. Reeks, J. Proudley, R. Groves and G. Bartlett .- A letter was read from the County Surveyor consenting to the Board's estimate of £7 a year for keeping in repair the main road over the bridge at Hurn .- Some discussion took place with regard to the dirty state of the main road at Freemantle, which it was pointed out was well nigh impassable because of the mud which was upon it from one side to the other .- Mr. Ellison said that it would to some extent do away with the inconvenience to footpassengers if the board allowed the surveyor to take a little gravel from Pokesdown hill, and lay it by the side of the road near the further end of the Rosebery park estate. 


The Mayoress having been formally introduced by the Pastor, the Bev G D HOOPER moved a vote of thanks to Mrs Parsons for her presence there that day. She had done, he said, many gracious things, but nothing more gracious than coming to the House of God to help them in their work. At that Church they had a very earnest and struggling people, while Mr Perkins was esteemed from one and of the town to the other as a Christian gentleman, as an earnest worker, and as a most strenuous pastor. 
